









The Coleshill School Tutor Reading Programme





At The Coleshill School we believe that every child should leave school able to read well and with confidence. It is through reading that a person is able to understand and interact with the world around them, communicate with others and strive for success. Therefore, we believe it is our mission to equip students with the necessary literacy skills before they leave school at either sixteen or eighteen. To enable our students to become competent readers we have introduced a reading programme during tutor time. Every student reads a novel with their tutor and tutor group and they read this novel twice a week. Below is the list of books that our students are studying in tutor. All books have been carefully selected for their reading age and content.

The Coleshill Tutor Reading Programme is underway. With stories ranging from murder mysteries, dragon quests, escape adventures, moral dilemmas and plans to deal with the end of the world, our Reading Programme is helping students explore the world beyond their classroom, expand their vocabularies and build their confidence in their reading power.
