

Actors, singers, models, performers, directors, choreographers, designers, stage managers, and other creative workers

- Negotiate contracts on behalf of musicians
- Tackle issues raised by musicians when there are employment disputes
- Give advice & support regarding copyright protection or unpaid fees
- Make sure working conditions are acceptable
- Assist members throughout their careers by networking

- Music publishers play a vital role in the development of new music and in taking care of the business side, allowing composers and songwriters to concentrate on their creative work.


Promotion

Supports (marketing & promotion) and encourages (publicity) a product for public awareness (i.e. live events)

- Secure a venue for a show
- Promote the show/ music release (social media,TV media, posters)
- Work with the artist to make sure all needs are covered (PA, effects)
- Cover the venue costs & costs of promotion (taking a percentage)
- Earn an agreed-to fee or royalties

Organisations

Services- provide/hire necessary amenities/resources to the music industry

Promotion- Advertising a product or artist

Venues- Where artists perform

Health & Safety- Ensuring the music industry meets all legal health and safety requirements

Agencies- talent agencies

Production- sound/ music production

Unions- supports those working in the music industry.

8 Mark Question Practice

Tips for Success

☑Underline the important parts of the question as you read it through:

Look at the examples in the questions from task 1 & 2. The important parts of the question are bold and underlined. In the exam, underline the key parts of the question. This will help keep your essay writing related to the question.

- Explain each point you make in detail. Use common sense and think logically about what could potentially result from it.
- ☑ Relate your answer to the important parts of the question (that you have underlined!!)
- Structure you answers carefully. Alternate between points for the different options.

If you only discuss one option, you can only score a maximum of 3/8. Structure your answer by writing a point and explanation for one option, then discuss the same point from the point of view of the other option. Use phrases to link your points such as: "However..... Alternatively..... On the other hand"




Music on the beach
