The Favela-Bairro Project Helps Poor People in Rio de Janeiro's Favelas

Often the <u>poorest people</u> in urban areas are the <u>worst affected</u> by the problems of urban growth. <u>Urban planning schemes</u> can help <u>reduce</u> the <u>impact</u> of these problems and improve the <u>quality of life</u> for the urban poor. An example of an urban planning scheme is the <u>Favela-Bairro Project</u> in Rio de Janeiro:

- <u>Rio de Janeiro</u> is in south east <u>Brazil</u>. It has more than <u>600</u> squatter settlements (called favelas), housing <u>one-fifth</u> of the city's population (more than <u>one million people</u>).
- 2) The Favela-Bairro project ran from 1995-2008 and involved 253 000 people in 73 favelas. It has led to:
 - <u>Social improvements</u> e.g. there are now day care centres for children, adult education classes and services to help people with drug or alcohol addictions.
 - <u>Economic improvements</u> e.g. the project is helping people get legal ownership of their properties and running training schemes to help people find better jobs.
 - <u>Environmental improvements</u> e.g. wooden buildings are being replaced with brick buildings, streets have been widened and paved, and there are now rubbish collection services.
