Getting To School

Travel to School

The school promotes and encourages safe and sustainable travel for all students to and from school. This includes methods such as walking, cycling or using public transport and will bring health and wellbeing benefits by doing so.





Arriving at School in the Morning



Students can enter school site via the Coventry Road or via Packington Lane. It is important that students walk on the pavements at all times and not on the road way, and must take care and pay attention to the cars and buses in the area.

The students should enter school via the side gate, to the left of the Sixth Form Centre with the main entrance for use by staff and visitors only. There are staff on duty in the canteen from 8am and students who arrive to school at this time may go to this area, as the rest of the site is unsupervised.



Dropping Off and Collecting Students



Where there is no alternative and parents choose to drive their child to school we encourage them to car share wherever possible. It can be difficult to park near to the school, especially at the beginning and end of the day. Parents/carers are asked to be mindful of local residents and to ensure they do not obstruct driveways or the school main entrances on Coventry Road and Packington Lane. The school site has a maximum 5mph limit. You are not allowed to drive onto the main car park for student and staff safety.

Morning drop off - please drive into the school and make a complete loop in the turning circle <u>before</u> dropping off your child, being mindful of other cars and students walking into school.

Afternoon collection - there is <u>no access</u> permitted to drive onto the school site at the end of the day for health and safety reasons. The school is very busy at this time with the school buses coming on to the school site and turning circle.



Travelling Safely to School

Safe travel to school is the responsibility of parents/carers and students as well as a priority for the school.

A446 Dual Carriageway

The school is situated near a very busy dual carriageway and as a condition of accepting a place at the school, all **parents/carers must agree to not allow their child to cross the A446** under any circumstance or by any method - as the road is deemed too dangerous to cross on foot or bicycle. The school has a zero tolerance policy of students crossing this road at any time. The information below - which encourages walking and cycling to school - excludes crossing the A446 under any circumstances.





Walking to School

Where students live a reasonable distance from school they are encouraged to walk to school - as long as there is a safe route to do so. They are also encouraged to wear reflective clothing such as arm bands and other accessories.

Cycling to School

Students are encouraged to cycle to and from school, however they are expected to do so safely and must ride along designated routes to maximise safety. They must wear a helmet at all times and ensure that the bike has suitable lights, and are encouraged to wear reflective clothing such as arm bands and other accessories. Students must keep bikes in one of the designated bike racks either in the front car park or behind the school side gates and ensure their property is locked with a suitable bike lock. Students storing bicycles at school do so at their own risk. It is preferred and recommended that students have undertaken some cycling proficiency training before choosing to cycle to school.

Public Buses

The National Express Bus service, X70, runs along the Coventry Road, and there is also a school service 891 which operates morning and afternoon, coming on to the school site. Full details are on the school website.

Parents and students are responsible for their behaviour on school journeys. Students on buses must act in a manner conducive to the school's Behaviour Policy and are reminded that they are ambassadors for the school at all times. The school will impose sanctions for students who behave inappropriately on school journeys.



How Parents/Carers Can Help and Support

Schools are only as good as the support they get from the parents and carers, and at The Coleshill School we always value this support.

Please help us by:

Ensuring that your child starts every day in a positive way by arriving on time (8:40am for a 8:45am start) in full school uniform, with the appropriate books, equipment and PE kit, having eaten a good breakfast

Talking to your son or daughter about work and progress at school and letting us know straight away if you or she/he has any worries or concerns

Letting us know if your son or daughter has a particular talent, gift or skill that we might encourage and develop further

Ensuring that reply slips on letters and emails that are sent home are completed, signed and returned straight away. It is often worth checking school bags for letters however the majority of contact is over email

Important letters will often be followed by a text, an email or will be available on our website. It is essential you let us know if your contact details change so that you can keep up to date with all of the latest information

A strong partnership between school and home is essential and we appreciate parents/carers working with us and supporting on matters such as study and behaviour. It is also effective for students to see school staff and parents/carers working together in partnership to maintain standards.

Your first point of contact should be your child's tutor.



Information for Parents and Carers

Lost Property

Please mark all property with your child's full name and tutor group. Any student who has mislaid an item of clothing or equipment should contact the Student Support Office.

Mobile Phones and Accessories

The Coleshill School will not accept responsibility or liability for the loss or damage incurred to any valuable items such as mobile phones, tablets etc. staff will not look after them for safe keeping - for example, during PE lessons. We have a policy of **no mobile devices/headphones anywhere in school**. If staff see students with these items they will be confiscated. On the first occasion, the device will be given back at the end of the day. However, on the second occasion, parents/guardians will be asked to collect the device themselves.

Meetings at School

As a parent/carer if you need to arrange a meeting at the school you can either:

We aim to arrange appointments where possible within 48 hours. Please ensure a booking is made when a meeting is required, it is not possible to meet with a member of staff without a prior booking. When you visit the school, please report to the Main Reception who will sign you in and issue you a visitors' badge.

Text Messaging

The school uses a text messaging service whereby we are able to send text messages/emails to advise you of school events, updates and closures. In order to ensure that this service is effective, it is essential that you keep us up to date with your current mobile phone number.

Attendance

At The Coleshill School we have worked hard to improve the attendance of our students which is currently 96%. We would ask you to help your child achieve this target in the following ways:

Encourage your child to be punctual and attend every day If you need to report that your child will be absent from school, please text the school on 07860 054 473 before 8:30am on each day your child will be absent – advising the reason for their absence. You can also get in touch about attendance or report absence by emailing <u>datateam@thecoleshillschool.org</u> When your child has been absent, encourage them to return to school so they can begin to catch up on work they have missed. We have support in place for any missed work to be completed during the school day



If you are at all concerned about your child not wanting to come to school, or notice any change in behaviour/attitude towards school, please contact the school Attendance Team:

We will keep you informed about your child's attendance by:

- Contacting you by break time via text if your child is absent and we do not receive a reason why.
- Sharing your child's current attendance at parents evenings, on school reports and through the 'My Child at School' App.
- Contacting and visiting you at home if we have concerns about your child's attendance.

Holidays During Term Time:

There is never a good time to take your child out of school. There is a clear link between good achievement and good attendance. We <u>do not</u> authorise any holidays during term time. In extreme circumstances a leave of absence may be requested by completing a form which can be collected from the Student Support Office – which is necessary for any absence request. If you choose to take your child out of school for an unauthorised holiday and your child has persistent unauthorised absence, you may be issued a fixed penalty notice.

Illness, Accident or Medical Issues:

The Coleshill School has trained first aid officers and a member of staff is always on duty to provide first aid during school hours. Should your child become unwell during the school day they will be encouraged to continue at school if they can. If this is not possible a first aider will make the decision whether or not to contact you to ask you to collect your child. <u>Students should not contact parents</u> directly.

Parents will be contacted where medical concerns or emergencies arise or if a student needs to attend hospital. In this instance, it is vital that the school has the most up to date telephone numbers for parents/carers so please make sure these are kept up to date with the school.

Where students have a medical condition or health care plan that requires administration of medication or following an agreed schedule or programme (e.g. diabetes, asthma), please make sure this is highlighted on the admissions form you return to school.



Punctuality

All students should be on school site by <u>8:40am</u> ready for an 8:45am start. It is important that students arrive to school on time. Key messages are often delivered at the start of the day and by arriving late they will miss important information. Students arriving late to school will be issued with behaviour points and if punctuality is a consistent issue students will receive a detention.

Demonstrate SPIRIT skills






Home Learning

We believe that home learning is part of being a "Coleshill Learner".

It embraces The Coleshill School's ethos of **SPIRIT** by encouraging and facilitating: **S**elf-management, **P**erseverance, Innovation, **R**eflection, Independence and **T**eamwork.



Aims of Home Learning:

To provide opportunities for students to work independently and to take responsibility for their own learning

To encourage students to develop a self-disciplined and self-motivating attitude to study

To help students recognise the link between good study habits and higher standards of achievement

To develop skills and encourage revision and consolidation of work covered in class

To extend learning covered in class by use of meaningful learning activities and develop research skills

To support parents'/carers' understanding of what their child(ren) are learning in school and develop home school links

In Years 7, 8 and 9, students will receive Home Learning in: Mathematics, English, Science, MFL, Humanities and Creative. Much of the Home Learning is set on the students' iPads using Showbie or Seneca. Students will be provided with their log-in details when they join the school.

School Uniform – Specifics (1)

Shoes

Flat black leather shoes with black soles and no other colours or marking (including any branding) are to be visible. Trainers, boots, heels, pumps or branded footwear such as: Converse, Nike, Huarache, Adidas flux, Vans, Puma etc. are **NOT** allowed.



Shirts

Shirts must have a collar (casual shirts are not permitted) and must be worn appropriately, i.e. <u>shirts</u> must be tucked in, collars buttoned to the top and ties worn



Please do not assume that stores who label their stock as 'School Wear' are an appropriate purchase. Please use the photographs above as a guide. If in doubt contact your child's Year Leader.



School Uniform – Specifics (2)

Students are expected to wear correct school uniform at all times in school and on journeys to and from school.

Uniform Suppliers

Most garments may be purchased in stores throughout the area. However, school badges, house ties and items in house colours or with the school logo on can only be purchased through our school suppliers. Purchases can be made either online OR at the store in Sheldon.

Coats, Hats and Accessories

- * Coats must not be worn instead of the school blazer
- * Hoodies must not be worn in place of a coat
- * Gilets must not be worn in place of a coat
- * Coats must not be worn in classrooms
- * Hats must not be worn whilst in school uniform
- * Hoodies, sweatshirts, cardigans or vest tops (including gilets) should not be worn in school
- * Hair accessories must be black, small, unobtrusive and functional

Hair

Hairstyles should be neat and conservative, in harmony with the blazer and uniform. In general, they should not be excessive or extreme, e.g. closely or decoratively shaved patterns on the scalp. **Parents/carers should seek guidance from the Year Leader about the suitability of hair styles BEFORE a visit to the hairdresser, if their child is considering a hairstyle which differs from the norm or may be considered as extreme. Colours which are not natural e.g. green/red/blue/pink/purple are not acceptable for school.**

Make-up

- * Make-up is not allowed.
- * Nail varnish or any false nails are not allowed.
- * Students breaching the make-up guidelines will be required to remove it.

Equipment

- * A strong waterproof bag for carrying books
- * Reading book
- *A pencil case with the following:

blue/black pens, red pen, pencils, ruler, eraser, scientific calculator, protractor, compass

Clothing and property should be clearly marked/labelled with the student's name.


It is essential that children carry ALL items of equipment listed above every day.

We have an extensive range of extra-curricular clubs and are always open to new ideas. Various activities usually take place: Computer Club, Library & Resource Centre, Home Learning Club, Performing Arts, School productions and rehearsal, STEM Club (Science, Technology, Engineering & Maths). We run sports clubs/teams including; Football, Cricket, Netball, Trampolining, Gymnastics, Dance, Track & Field, Rugby and Basketball.



Children's University

We aim for all of our Year 7 students to be enrolled in the Children's University. This is an exciting project that reflects our vision of students learning beyond the classroom and aspiring for excellence. Students are introduced to the programme at the start of the year and collect stamps in their 'passport to learning' for attending after-school activities. Rewards

Students at the school are rewarded through the use of **SPIRIT** points for being ready to learn and committed to being the best that they can be. In return, we enter students for various prize draws as well as organising rewards trips. Examples include: pizza and movie afternoons, Drayton Manor Adventure Park, Tamworth Snowdome for ice-skating and snow adventures, and Alton Towers.





Student Leadership

We actively encourage the involvement of students to support the leadership of the school through joining the Student Leadership Team an initiative which is highly valued by staff and governors.

Safeguarding

'Under the Education Act 2002 (Section 175), schools must make arrangements to safeguard and promote the welfare of children. The Children Act 2006 requires all school staff to pass on information which gives rise to a concern about a child's welfare, including risk from neglect, physical, emotional or sexual abuse. The staff will seek, in general, to discuss any concerns with the parent/carer and where appropriate seek their consent to a referral to Social Care. This will only be done where such discussion will not place the child at increased risk of significant harm. Schools will seek advice from Social Care when they have reasonable cause to suspect a child may be suffering or likely to suffer significant harm. Occasionally, concerns are passed on which are later shown to be unfounded. Parents/carers will appreciate that the designated person for child protection was carrying out their responsibilities in accordance with the law and acting in the best interests of all children.'

ParentPay

The Coleshill School is a cashless school which means we cannot accept cash for any types of school payment. **ParentPay** is the school's online payment system that lets you make secure online payments by credit and debit card.



It can be used to pay for school meals and other items such as uniform, trips and music lessons and offers you the freedom to make payments whenever and wherever you like, 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

Parents will have a secure online account, which is activated using a unique username and password. The School will send you information on how to activate your account and your activation details in due course.

Financial Assistance

Since July 2014, Warwickshire has changed their Free School Meals application process, making it much easier for parents/carers to find out whether they are eligible. The process can be completed quickly online using the link below. You will only need your contact details, national insurance number and child's details in order to apply. If your child is currently receiving free school meals at a Warwickshire Primary school, this information will be passed to us and you do not need to reapply. If your child is currently receiving Free School Meals at a school outside of Warwickshire or attended a school under a different Local Authority, you will need to reapply. You can do this by visiting: <u>http://www.warwickshire.gov.uk/freeschoolmeals</u>.

The process is quick and confidential and provides further benefits to your child. For every child who is eligible for Free School Meals, The Coleshill School receives additional government funding called the Pupil Premium, which provides funding to support whole school improvement and other resources to help with things such as: home learning, bus passes, uniform and peripatetic music lessons. The spending of the Pupil Premium is intended to improve the achievement of students who:

- * Are entitled to free school meals, or have received free school meals in the last 6 years.
- * Are in care or children whose parent/carers serve in the armed forces.
- * Have been adopted from care, or who left care under a Special Guardianship Order/ Residence Order.
