Once we have read our book, we complete a quiz on Accelerated Reader. **The more quizzes we do the more points we receive and "points mean prizes"**





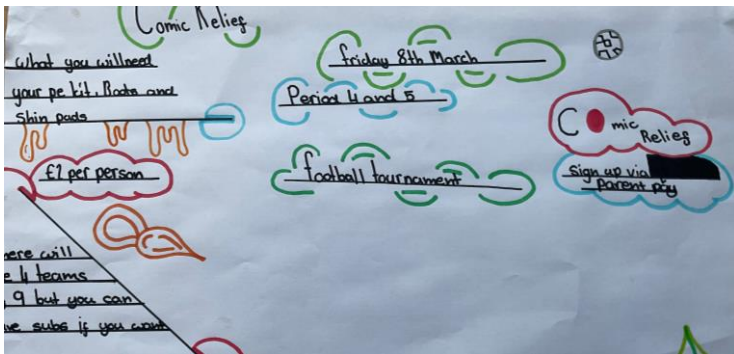

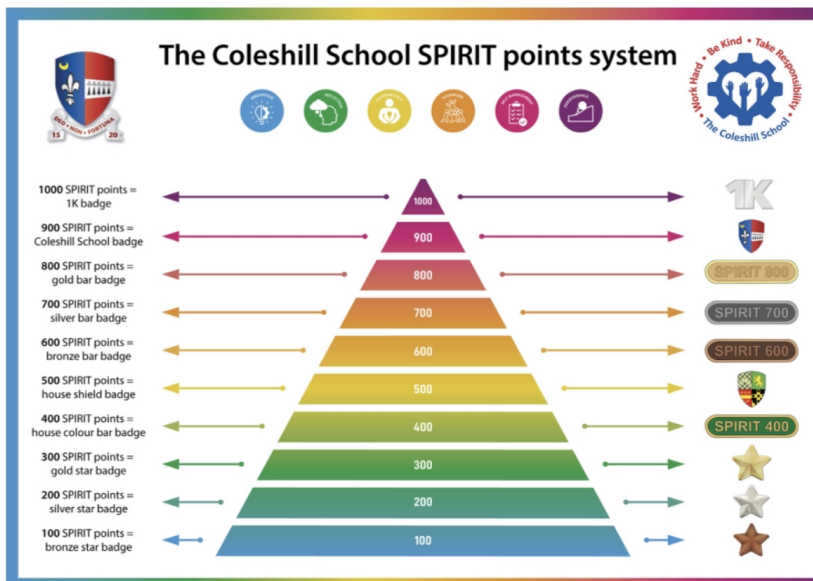


Reading Leaders
